#### Jamboree-On-The Air 2014:

What: The club's second consecutive year of providing a JOTA station for local scouts.

<u>Who</u>: Scouts of all ages—both girls and boyplus any hams who would like to help introduce amateur radio to young people.

<u>When</u>: Saturday with operation beginning at 10:00 AM until mid-afternoon.

Where: St. Mary's Catholic Church, 1303 West Broadway, St. Winona.

Other info: The station, operating with the special callsign K2BSA/0, is one of 200 currently registered for JOTA operations. The World Scout Bureau reported that the 2012 JOTA had nearly 700,000 Scout participants at more than 13,500 amateur radio stations! A participant patch is available, as is a certificate/log sheet that can also be used to fulfill a Radio Merit Badge
