Packet again available

Packet radio boasts an impressive and long pedigree. It was developed in the early 1980s when home computers were just beginning to become popular. After some 40 years it has turned into a valuable emergency communications tool.

The Winona Amateur Radio Club is off to a good start with a packet station at our Witoka tower. Erik Brom, WBØNIU configured direwolf for connected mode packet on 145.030, and connected recently with Ken Weigel, W9GM, in La Crosse for a great keyboard to keyboard QSO. Weigel donated an Alinco radio to the club for packet use.

The digipeater at Witoka on 145.030 is WØNE-1, or alias WITOKA.

The node will be on the antenna at 300 feet, and APRS will return to its normal 50 foot level on 144.390. Long term we plan to add another channel on 145.670. 145.030 is primarily a Wisconsin network, and 145.670 is primarily a Minnesota network. The set-up will allow communication throughout Minnesota, Wisconsin and Upper Michigan. went very well. I think the 10 folks that operated and other visitors who came to eat, watch, and learn all had a good time. As Hams we are always looking at ways to do things better and this year's Field Day left us with some thinking points of things to improve. For example, screen tents have screens on four sides...rain comes through screens! Tents use flies to keep dry inside. We will certainly work on a way to stay dry in our screen tents.

Trustee: Erik Brom, WBØNIU. WØIH will work on the portable repeater to assure it is working well. It is needed in September for Waumandee, maybe Ride the Ridges.

WBØNIU is planning for the Waumandee Hill Climb and Ride The Ridges. He will lead the Waumandee car event and be involved in Ride The Ridges planning with WKØW. WKØW has the Rotary Club's information; together they will check communications on new route.

There are eight 26Ah batteries ready for the146.835 site. Keith Laken, KEØIJI, and Wayne Oliver, KØWLO, said they would help.

WBØNIU is reorganizing and setting up a duplexer for packet at Witoka. Having packet, a great emergency communications mode, is another reason for the club to use the Witoka tower.

Public Service: Dan Goltz, WKØW. The county EOC is now open again, and Skywarn and other emergency operations will be conducted from there. Operations have been from there within the past couple weeks and equipment seems to be fully functional.

WBØNIU has been working with both Minnesota and Wisconsin groups to interface a packet system with them. The equipment is located at the Witoka tower. Preliminary testing has been very successful. This link will allow us to send text messages across Minnesota, Wisconsin and up to Upper Michigan, and give us access to the Winlink system for emergency traffic handling.

Russ Marsolek, NØQK, Walt Kelly, KEØXI, and WK0W will attend a SE Emergency Management Joint Powers Board communications exercise July 7. It included a weather emergency exercise with a tornado taking-out Lewiston.

There has been discussion regarding storage of club equipment and availability and rapid retrieval in case of emergency need. Equipment such as antennas, coax, extra radios, power supplies, the portable repeater etc., needs to be stored in a secure, weather protected, and accessible place.

Linking Project: Dan Goltz, WKØW. Les, KØBAD, will be in town for three months in the fall and has volunteered his riverside location as a link and internet source.
